The Final Evening's Ringing at St. Giles, Oxford (8) before the rehanging of the bells.

We gathered last Sunday 31st July to ring at St Giles before the evening service. It was the last ring before the construction works began to retune and rehang the bells. It was a joyful evening of ringing, with thirteen ringers present. I asked John Pusey, Tower Captain how he felt about it...

"Well it's all about the Phoenix, the ashes and then rising again. As we rang for the last time I felt a little

sad. I just hope the band won't split up and defect to another tower in the interval". After ringing the bells down we went to The Royal Oak for a beer, and topics and



logistics were discussed - such as the initiation health and safety morning for the helpers, what colour should the sallies be, should we digitally record the whole process, should we have a dress code for the tower, and maybe initiate a 'Frequent Ringer Programme' with bonus points and prizes and of course what to do with the infamous carpet.... "Burn it" said Simon. "Bury

Bernard "and put it back in the tower"! "Cut it up and give a piece of it to each benefactor according to the size of the donation" said Margaret, Simon and others... "Donate it to the Pitt Rivers Museum" says Philip. "Hold an auction with bidding for the sallies and the carpet as souvenirs" said Steve... "Print an image of the carpet on t-shirts for ringers to wear in the tower" said John... "Only on a t-shirt" said David! And so on. And it was a jolly send off to the bells on their journey out of St Giles church for the adventure of a

lifetime – well one of them, for they have lived a long time.... Margaret Marsh.

Scaffolding has already been put up outside the tower at St Giles. On Mon 1st August, builders started opening up the bell-chamber window, through which the bells will be removed; and the bells will actually be removed via the external scaffolding on Tuesday 9th and Wednesday 10th August (photo-opportunities!) by Whites of Appleton, who will be responsible for the rehanging. All eight bells are to be retuned at Whitechapel, and if all goes smoothly, the bells should be back in use early in November. Meanwhile, other neighbouring towers are likely to see more than usual of visitors from St Giles at practices and on Sundays. We would still welcome further donations but are probably now within about £2,000 of the estimated total of £56,000 required. John Pusey.
