A Training Morning.

On Saturday 5 February, I attended a Training morning at Thame (8), organised on behalf of the ODG for branch representatives. The most popular topic during the opening discussion session was the perennial problem of how to teach rounds ringers the combination of skills required for change-ringing. Later, we moved to the tower, and attempted some unusual and challenging exercises: Rounds with all of the band facing outwards, or with the odd-numbered bells ringing backstrokes and evens ringing handstrokes. 'Kaleidoscope ringing' - all sorts of combinations of pairs of adjacent bells dodging, making places, or long places (four blows at a time). 'Bayles Doubles' - a variation of Plain Bob Doubles, with each lead extended by the treble lying in 5ths for four blows instead of two, while the 2nds place bell turns round in

fourths; as a consequence, e.g. the fourth dodges in 4-3 down every time the treble leads, giving a learner a chance to practice the same piece of work much more frequently than usual, in a single practice touch. John Pusey.
