Finally, on to St Barnabas at Peasemore where we were the first visiting band to ring since the rehanging of the bells, and they were beautiful to ring. It was as if
 these six bells could 'ring themselves'! We found the church full of beautiful flowers and learnt that a prestigious wedding was to be held later that day for David Cameron's sister!
Then it was on to a pub for late lunch - the excellent Bell Inn at Aldworth, which has not been ruined by alterations for smart tourist types, and is favoured by visiting bikers and old car enthusiasts. Like them, we enjoyed the sunshine and beer, and a good Ploughman's lunch!
