
### Congratulations to Paul Kimber on ringing his first Quarter Peal!

## Ringing and Picnic at St James, Aston Abbotts (6).

This charming village takes its name from the abbey here that served as a country residence for the abbots of St. Albans. Abbey House is built over the original abbey and

Czech president Edvard Benes during World War II. The garden has a lake with two islands within it named after the ships (Erebus & Terror) used by Sir James Clark Ross, the discoverer of the magnetic North Pole (1831) who lived in the village. The church was rebuilt during Victorian times with the tower remaining from C16 and three of the bells (2,3 & 5) dating back to 1652, cast by blacksmiths in Drayton Parslow. After a day of heavy showers the weather was kind to us in the early evening as we pooled our







ringing the bells!
