

## Mini Outing to Chedworth and Withington on Saturday $\mathbf{2 2}^{\text {nd }}$ September.

 These are two of the lesser known beauty spots of the Cotswolds in the valley created by the River Coln and River Churn, and they were looking at their most resplendent on such a sunny day. Chedworth Roman Villa is one of the best-preserved such sites in England and the village was abounding with tourists as we arrived. Both churches and their sets of bells were equally memorable, making the ringing all the more enjoyable, with Chedworth (6) having a working water-wheel at the foot of its churchyard and Withington (6) having a lake adjacent to its perimeter. ## Doubles to Minor Practice at Hatherop (6) 7cwt on Sunday 16th September.



Although there has been a settlement here since preNorman times, Hatherop in Gloucestershire is primarily an early Victorian 'model' village with its parish church of the same period tucked away amidst Hatherop Castle School, a 17th century style of castle converted into a school during the 20th century. ## A Strange Piece of History -

 Bellringers sometimes ring for strange reasons! On Wednesday $29^{\text {th }}$ August, dedicated Sydney ringers rose early and travelled to St Philip's at Church Hill (8) to ring the bells to comply with the provisions of a bequest. This bequest was to perpetuate the memory of a certain Mr Charles Moore, Mayor of Sydney and Parliamentarian who died in 1895, and left to the bellringers a gift of dividends from certain stock. The stipulations of the bequest was the annual chiming (at the exact hour of his birth on the $29^{\text {th }}$ August each year between 6am and 7am) of the 'Old Hundredth'the old hymn - to be pealed seven times each time for one verse of the composition. So once more the bequest was carried out. The reward is no longer financial for the bellringers but for thousands of commuters on their way to work it was a more joyful start to the day!
