




## Mini Outing to Chedworth and Withington on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> September

These are two of the lesser known beauty spots of the Cotswolds in the valley created by the River Coln and River Churn, and they were looking at their most resplendent on such a sunny day. Chedworth Roman Villa is one of the best-preserved such sites in England and the





village was abounding with tourists as we arrived. Both churches and their sets of bells were equally memorable, making the ringing all the more enjoyable, with Chedworth (6) having a working water-wheel at the foot of its churchyard and Withington (6) having a lake adjacent to its perimeter. 
### Doubles to Minor Practice at Hatherop (6) 7cwt on Sunday 16th September.



Although there has been a settlement here since pre-Norman times, Hatherop in Gloucestershire is primarily an early Victorian 'model' village with its parish church of the same period tucked away amidst Hatherop Castle School, a 17th century style of castle converted into a school during the 20th century. The bell-ropes in the ringing chamber fall in a semi-circle and were conducive to our minor method ringing. Hugh Deam.




#### Sarah Wheeler rings with the Ruabon ringers.
