

John Pusey's Trip to Japan

For those of you who didn't know, John is having an extended holiday in Japan! These are some of the pictures he's just sent me:

"The first picture shows me sounding a bell (with a rope attached to the clapper) close to the top of Mount Asahidake, in a National Park in the centre of Hokkaido. The peak is about 7,500ft, so (having used a cable car) we were probably at least 6,000ft. In the background you can see



plumes of volcanic steam blowing up out of the ground at the foot of the top section of the mountain, from only just a little higher than where I was standing.

The second shows a view of the whole mountain, from road level at the foot of the mountain, perhaps at about 2,500ft. The bases of the plumes of steam, and probably the bell tower as well, are just out of sight behind the green hill in the foreground.

The third shows a different kind of tower, with one conventional bell plus a set of tubular bells, in the centre of the nearby town of Biei. I am just pointing at it - there wasn't any rope to get hold of!"

The City Branch trip to London takes place on Saturday 20th October. I believe that all towers but Garlickhythe are now confirmed. So far, I have the time of the first tower only - St Margaret's, at which we should aim to arrive at 10.00am. I also do not have details of the lunch venue, but I hope to send another email soon, filling in all of the remaining gaps (including more detailed travel information). There will be a fee of £1 or so for each of the five towers. If traveling by train, get the 08.01 from Oxford Central, arriving in London Paddington at 08.59. Then get the Underground to Westminster via Baker Street. Note: there is an 08.16 train from Oxford, arriving at 09.14, but this involves a change at Reading. This would be the last train it's possible to catch to make sure you arrive on time.
