#### R.I.P. Bob Benstead. 5th June 1918 - November 2012

Bob hailed from Brightwell cum Sotwell and sang in the choir at the church. His father was a policeman and who moved around the Abingdon/North Berkshire area so Bob rang at many of the local towers. Bob came to Oxford to work at Cowley, and it was then he began his ringing association with St. Aldates.

He subsequently became a fixture at North Hinksey and St. Giles. Bob was a Guild ringer for some 70 years and notched up many hundreds of peals and quarter peals. Famously his favourite method was Stedman and he was a loyal supporter of Branch outings. Bob was also a keen gardener. For many years, Summer holidays were spent in the West Country where he visited many of the towers, becoming especially well known around the Barnstaple area. Even though he was latterly constrained by disability, Bob was still enthusiastic about his ringing and continued to make it to several events a year and contributed greatly with his bags of aluminium cans for recycling that brought valuable funds for the Branch. # Margaret Marsh rings a large bell in China!

At the Wild Goose Pagoda and Buddhist Temple in the city of Xi'an in China, I had the opportunity to ring a huge iron bell! The ancient city of Xi'an, the burial place of the Hidden Warriors was one of my stops on a recent tour of China. The bell dates back to the Jin Dynasty around 1192. The sound of the bell is 'crisp and pleasant' and can be heard from around five miles away. The purpose of the bell is for 'alarming' and for 'timing'. It is obviously not a bell for change ringing, but as you can see is static in a wooden frame and a battering ram is swung against it! For the price of five 'Yuan', I was permitted to strike the bell three times. This is supposed to bring 'happiness and good luck'! It was a very positive and happy experience. In the city of Xi'an there is also a large bell tower 36 metres high. It was built in 1384 in the Ming Dynasty. This bell tower is one of the grandest in China and contains several large bronze cast bells. Margaret Marsh in Sydney
