Branch Striking Competition on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> May

Six teams met at **North Hinksey** to take part in the Branch Striking Competition, including several new faces who had not competed in a competition before. The format was simple-two minutes to practise and familiarise yourselves with the bells, then one minute of rounds followed by 120 changes of any method or an equivalent length of call changes. Our judges for the day, John and Cathy Hughes-D'Aeth, clearly had their work cut out and were very pleased they had chosen to judge from inside their car when the heavens opened during the fifth team's test piece! By the time they returned with the results, the tea had all but gone, and the teams were on tenterhooks. With a wide range of ringing abilities on show, it can be difficult to balance the comments fairly, but the judges gave some very constructive advice to the teams that had struggled with the bells, and gently chastised the experienced bands for opting to ring a simple doubles method rather than stretching their abilities. However, it was the striking that was being judged, and the bands were placed in the following order:

St Aldate's (A) 12 faults.
 Oxford University Society 28 faults.
 St Aldate's (B) 41 faults.
 Kidlington 43 faults.
 Headington 64 faults.
 St Giles 65 faults.

The Branch will therefore be represented by St Aldate's in the Guild competition later in the year. It was great to see so many teams, especially the OUS, who were just there for the fun of taking part.
