At 12.30pm we will also be visiting Lillingstone Lovell (right) which has been augmented to a 6 fairly recently - details below.





How to find us part 2

2 Turn right here, taking the path clockwise round the playing field (red arrows).

- 3 Turn sharp left under the stone arch.
- 4 The remaining route is on a one way system of rougher paths.
- 5 Park here beside the path.

The Church is hidden in a ring of trees. When you leave, follow the one way route shown by green arrows on the map. There's one tight section between buildings. Easy really!
