## **Roy Jones Memorial Tree Planting**

On Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> January, the Marston ringers joined the Parish Council, family and residents at a short tree planting ceremony in



memory of ringer Roy Jones who died in May 2014. The tree is a White Willow (Salix Alba) and is planted in the Mortimer Hall Recreation Ground at the junction of Oxford Road and Marston Ferry Road. Not only did Roy maintain an extraordinary bell-ringing career of seventy years largely based at the tower of St. Nicholas, Marston, but had for many years contributed significantly to local affairs through the Parish and Parochial Church Councils. Parish Council Chairman, Charles Haynes, and City Councillor Mick Haines addressed the ceremony highlighting Roy's notable input. A plaque is to be made marking Roy's tree and will be attached to the adjacent railings. *Anthony Hughes* 



## Abingdon (10) and Benson (8) – Saturday 24th January

The fact that it has been twelve years (February 2003) since the last time I booked a 10-bell tower for practice ringing, coincidentally the self-



same tower of St. Helen's, Abingdon (10), attests to the rollercoaster ride that is bell-ringing. Being a Branch devoid of 10-bells towers means that it should come as no surprise that the further reaches of the diagrams book are not well-thumbed for the vast majority of ringers and equally that to book a 10-bell tower is fraught with risk as to turnout and scope of ambition, especially in the midst of winter. leading up to the day itself. Fortunately a degree of contingency planning meant that the morning ultimately proved of inordinate benefit to ringers from the City Branch and **Witney & Woodstock Branch**, with grateful thanks due to the Abingdon and Benson ringers who pitched in to make method ringing possible. Within sight of the church in **Benson (8)** the morning was rounded off by lunch at the Waterfront Café overlooking the River Thames. We had reserved a table, and just as well, as this is an immensely popular eatery, boasting
