The last wedding with full circle ringing was a couple of years before that and only four of the six ringers made it past five minutes before giving it their best, so with that in mind, it was probably without much positive expectation that engineers from Whitechapel were booked to carry out an assessment. After a few hours of palliative work, their prognosis was surely better than could have been hoped, with a hastily concocted band finding them comfortable to ring, with Plain Bob Minor



being readily achievable. As it turned out, the wedding was cancelled, but this opened the door for the other wedding scheduled for this year and after having to cast the net pretty wide we managed to recruit six ringers for the big day. Although considerable work will be required to return this set of bells to their original majesty, wheels have been set in motion by way of making this happen. Clearly this is no more than is deserved, given the history, architecture and commanding location of the church, plus the affiliation with the theological college across the road. Hugh Deam
