A Practice at Eynsham (6) on Saturday 30th April

Eynsham, having been part of my regular Sunday morning rota of service ringing for some twenty years now, I suspect that I have spent more of my time on the ropes here than at any other tower other than Marston and North Hinksey, but familiarity in this case breeds contentment as they are such fine bells and consequently this was an excellent morning's get-together.
