Three 'firsts' in one Quarter Peal at Headington (8)

It's not often so much is achieved in one single quarter peal of Grandsire Triples! On Sunday 5th June, Rachel Croft from Headington and Rosie Cretney from Cowley both rang their first quarter peals 'inside', while Caillan Crowe-McAuliffe from St Giles in Oxford, rang his first quarter peal on the Tenor (although he has rung a previous quarter on the Tenor of 6 bells). 
It goes without saying that all of us at Headington will miss him and his excellent ringing, and that we wish him the very best for the future! Paul Lucas

An Outing to Evenley (6) and Whitfield (6) in Northamptonshire on Saturday 4th June

School holidays, yes, a vacation from ringing, no, with the week bookended by a busy morning of requested methods on the ever engaging bells of Chilton on Bank Holiday Monday and a mix of quarter peal and general ringing in South Northamptonshire on Saturday morning.







The county motto of Northamptonshire is Rosa Concordia signum, and judging by the cordial welcome we received it's clearly more than just historically emblematic. The emblem of the county is the rose, although the county flower is the cowslip, but dominating the churchyard at Evenley was a Wellingtonia (Giant Sequoia) that rises above the height of the church spire and brings a touch of California to this ostensibly English setting. The church in Whitfield is almost identical in its structure to the one in Evenley, minus a clock, primarily due to it having the same architectural designer. A heavy gale in early 1869 caused the tower to collapse, thus necessitating a rebuilding of the church only four years after Evenley church had been rebuilt. An excellent lunch was then enjoyed in the elevated surroundings of the Hayloft Café at Boycott Farm, offering up the opportunity for a birds' eye view of the busy farm shop below. This southern part of the county has its own motto, Hora e Sempre, and on the evidence of the warmth of our welcome at both towers and the variegation of farm shop cafes in the area (we lunched in the cosy loft café of Rachel's Farm in Turweston last year), we will now and always be making tracks this way for ringing events.
